John 20:1-9

On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb.

So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, “They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don’t know where they put him.”

So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb.

They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first; he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in.

When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place.

Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed.

For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead.

As Mary had suffered in union with her Son dying upon the Cross, so did she share in His joy and happiness after His Resurrection; the life of Mary always conformed to the life of Jesus and faithfully reflected it. For whom was the first visit of the Risen Lord? Assuredly it must have been for His Mother! It would be only just that she having shared in the Sacrifice of His death more completely than any one else should have the first news, the first grace, the first joy of His Resurrection! Therefore He would have gone to her immediately on coming forth from the tomb, glorified and triumphant. He had parted from her in tears, He returns to her with joy! What a moment for Mary, when her Risen Jesus embraces her with all the love and respect that she merited!
