Gospel
Luke 11:1-13

Jesus was praying in a certain place, and when he had finished, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray just as John taught his disciples."

He said to them, "When you pray, say: Father, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come. Give us each day our daily bread and forgive us our sins for we ourselves forgive everyone in debt to us, and do not subject us to the final test."

And he said to them, "Suppose one of you has a friend to whom he goes at midnight and says, 'Friend, lend me three loaves of bread, for a friend of mine has arrived at my house from a journey and I have nothing to offer him,' and he says in reply from within, 'Do not bother me; the door has already been locked and my children and I are already in bed. I cannot get up to give you anything.'

I tell you, if he does not get up to give the visitor the loaves because of their friendship, he will get up to give him whatever he needs because of his persistence. "And I tell you, ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you.

For everyone who asks, receives; and the one who seeks, finds; and to the one who knocks, the door will be opened.

What father among you would hand his son a snake when he asks for a fish? Or hand him a scorpion when he asks for an egg?

If you then, who are wicked, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him?"

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

The Church in Latin America boasts the world's largest Catholic population. However, a study commissioned in the late 1990s by the federation of Latin American Catholic bishops' conferences, found that Latin Americans were leaving the Church at the alarming rate of approximately 8,000 people each day. This exodus is the result of complex reasons, ranging from the strain that economic globalization places on communities to well-financed competition from other groups that are drawing people away from the Church. Because of a very low priest-to-parishioner ratio and the local churches' inability to support the substantial number of parishioners, many of the faithful often seek a personal experience and closer sense of community elsewhere. In addition, migration across the region can rupture the bonds of family and community in which faith is nurtured and can grow.

To confront these tendencies, the **Collection for the Church in Latin America, held on July 24-25**, supports pastoral projects that engage Latin American parishioners in their faith, strengthening their sense of mission and identity with the Church. Your generous support of the collection provides evangelization in rural and poverty-stricken areas, religious training and catechesis and formation programs. The cost of your daily cup of coffee could provide a young girl with her First Holy Communion book.

Together, we can keep faith with the Church in Latin America. Thank you for your generous response. May God bless you. Sincerely in Christ,
